Today's fun includes an eye spy, an activity to create your own dinosaur, and a matching game!

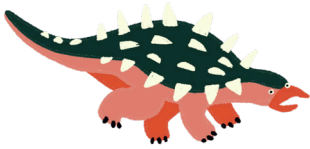
Discover the Dinos!

Where does it live?

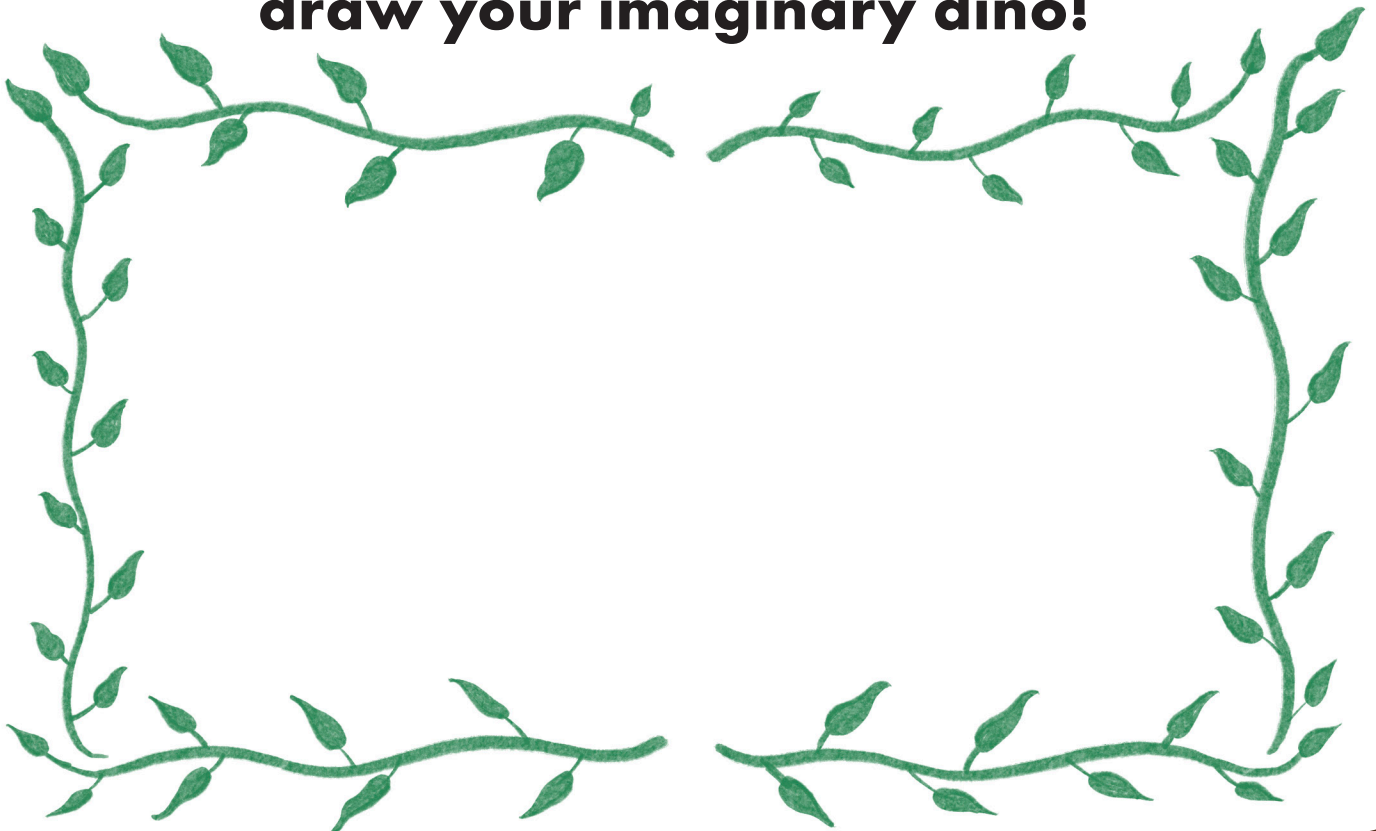
What shape is it?

Does it have scales or feathers?

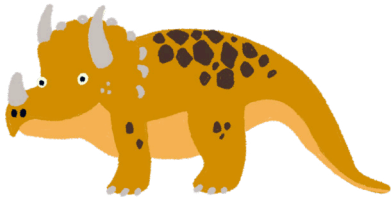
How long is it's tail?

Use your answers to those questions to draw your imaginary dino!

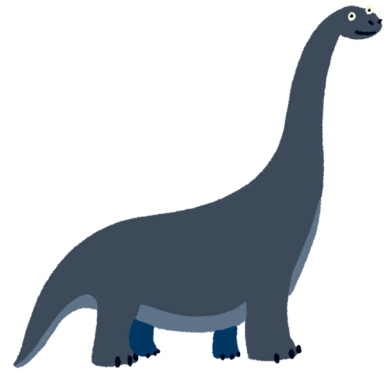


Prehistoric Matching
